PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It has been a privilege to serve as President of the South Australian Athletic League for the past three years. I want to sincerely thank all members of our great organisation for your support, commitment, and above all, your passion for the sport of athletics.

Season Overview

The 2024/25 season marked another step forward for the League. We released the season calendar well ahead of the opening event, allowing athletes and coaches to plan effectively. Our pre-Christmas program was refined to better align with the needs of our athletic community, and we continued to develop the systems that support our carnival operations.

We are pleased to report a modest increase in athlete participation and a small financial surplus. Our income was impacted by the rescheduling of the Mort Daly Carnival to the slot allocated for Brighton in January due to extreme heat. We chose to invest in upgrading our handicapping and meet management system as well as the repainting of our new trailer.

Strategic and Operational Progress

The League's investment in our handicapping system remains a top priority. In 2024/25, we continued to enhance its functionality and integrity, including an increased focus on educating coaches and athletes about its application—particularly in junior and cross-age categories. Next season will see formal opportunities for coaches to deepen their understanding of how the system works.

We are proud to report substantial progress in our relationship with the Victorian Athletic League. We have reached agreements on data sharing and are exploring alignment of both competition rules and handicapping approaches. This collaboration bodes well for the future of professional athletics across Australia.

Our social media presence also continues to grow, despite operating on an extremely limited budget. The increased online engagement has complemented our community presence and helped promote events like the Bay Sheffield.

Bay Sheffield and Community Impact

The Bay Sheffield continues to cement its place as South Australia's premier footrace. This year, athlete participation increased, including a strong showing from interstate competitors. The atmosphere at Colley Reserve was exceptional, and feedback from athletes, spectators, and stakeholders was overwhelmingly positive. We thank the South Australian Government, Holdfast Bay and sponsors for their support.

We were honoured to be selected by the South Australian Government to deliver the "Fastest Community Footballer" races during Gather Round. The event showcased our sport to a broader audience and received commendations from both the AFL and government representatives. Special thanks go to the volunteers and athletes who braved the extreme heat to deliver a fantastic result.

Challenges

Despite our successes, the League continues to face challenges:

- Post-New Year attendance remains impacted by the timing of National, State, and Surf Life Saving championships.
- Athlete travel reluctance has made it difficult to sustain regional carnivals, despite strong community interest.
- Confusion around junior handicapping, particularly where U14 athletes compete in U18 or U18 in senior events, remains an area requiring better education and communication.

We are committed to addressing these issues in a respectful and transparent way and welcome member feedback to help guide our improvement.

Looking Ahead to 2025/26

As we prepare for the next season, we will focus on:

- Launching a pre-season recruitment drive targeting all ages.
- Strengthening partnerships with State Government, local Councils, and the South Australian Tourism Commission to elevate the Bay Sheffield as the premier event of the summer.
- Aligning handicapping approaches with the VAL.
- Delivering more accessible education to coaches on rules and handicapping.
- Increasing volunteer recruitment and support, ensuring our carnivals continue to run efficiently.

I also want to signal that I will be advocating for stronger penalties for breaches of the League's code of conduct, particularly in relation to inappropriate behaviour toward officials. Regrettably, the 2024/25 season saw two members suspended for such breaches. Going forward, I will propose a zero-tolerance approach, including suspension or revocation of coaching accreditation for serious offences, including abusive phone or text communications with officials.

Acknowledgements

To our volunteers—you are the backbone of the League. From handicappers, stewards, and starters, to judges, colour stewards, and timekeepers thank you for your dedication and resilience in often challenging conditions. Week after week, you make our sport possible.

To our Committee, thank you for your tireless efforts and vision. I want to especially thank Phil Daws, who is stepping down this year. Phil has been a wise and steady presence and leaves with our deep appreciation.

To our Executive Officer Jenny Poole—your behind-the-scenes dedication and countless hours of support have been invaluable. You are the heartbeat of the League, and we thank you sincerely.

Final Reflections

We have worked hard this season to remain open to ideas and feedback, and to make decisions that are in the best interest of the League and its members. I believe we continue to honour the proud history of the SAAL while evolving to meet the future.

To the over 400 athletes who competed across our events this year: you are the reason we exist. Watching your determination, camaraderie, and growth inspires us all. Thank you for being part of our community—we look forward to seeing you again in 2025/26.

Income

Registration and Nomination Income

The 2024/2025 Season saw strong growth in our registration and race nomination income with increased membership and attendance at our meets.

Sponsorships

Support and confidence in the SA Athletic League also grew with increased sponsorship, in particular for the Bay Sheffield and also with the Gather Round Sprint.

Expenditure

Race Meeting Expenses

Race meeting expenses for 24/25 were up, predominantly due to inclusion of the Gather Round Sprint and an increased spend on improving the Bay Sheffield Carnival in line with funding requirements. We also received grants which enabled us to invest in new race day equipment that would help both volunteers and improve race day.

Admin & Office Expenses

We have chosen to invest in our future by improving offerings to members with a new website and investment into the Meet Management, Registration and Handicapping Systems. The increased functionality for members, handicappers and administration will provide time and cost savings for years to come. We have teamed up with the Victorian Athletic League so that we can both share costs and provide a platform for members that is consistent and easier to use across the two states.

We have also had the trailer painted and branded. It now provides valuable exposure for both the League, Bay Sheffield and sponsors as it travels around the state to all of our meets.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the year ended 30 April 2025

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation

This financial report is a special purpose report prepared for distribution to members in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act (SA) 1985. The committee has determined that the South Australian Athletic League Inc ('the League') is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(b) Income Tax

The League is exempt from Income Tax under section 23g(iii) of the Income Tax Assessment Act

(c) Revenue and other income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue. Grant and donation revenue is recognised when the League obtains control over the funds. All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST)

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities up to 12 months.

(e) Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value.

(f) Property, plant and equipment

The depreciable amount of all property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(g) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the League's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting year. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(h) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of GST, except where the GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST





BAY SHEFFIELD HALL OF FAME



Bay Sheffield Hall of Fame Legend - Brendon Wilson

The South Australian Athletic League is proud to announce that Brendon Wilson, a former Bay Sheffield winner, has been named the very first inductee into the Bay Sheffield Hall of Fame.

Brendon, one of three brothers—Pat, Brendan, and Michael—who all competed in the Bay Sheffield Carnival, is celebrated for his remarkable achievements at Glenelg. His

legendary status is well-deserved, as his contributions to the sport are extraordinary.

Brendon won the 1971 Bay Sheffield 130-yard event, running into a two-yard headwind. Starting off a handicap mark of six yards, he quickly surged ahead to win comfortably in a time of 12.2 seconds in front of a crowd of 3,000 spectators. His time was an impressive two yards inside "even time," showcasing his incredible talent. He was trained by former Bendigo winner Sam Baldwyn.

A versatile athlete, Brendon also achieved the unique distinction of winning the Patawalonga Handicap over 400 yards in three consecutive years (1968, 1969, and 1970) at the Bay Sheffield Carnival. His dominance over the 400-meter distance earned him three titles in consecutive years.

Brendan's toughness as an athlete was unparalleled. Competing well into his 40s, he won titles across Australia and in the United States in events ranging from 100 meters to 400 meters.

Remarkably, Brendan overcame significant adversity in his life. After contracting polio at the age of four, he was confined to a steel frame for two years, with doctors doubting he would ever walk again. Yet, through sheer determination and resilience, Brendan defied all odds to become a champion and an inspiration to many.

The South Australian Athletic League congratulates Brendon Wilson on his induction into the Bay Sheffield Hall of Fame—a fitting tribute to an extraordinary athlete and his incredible legacy.



Bay Sheffield Hall of Fame Inductee - Matt Barber

Matt Barber literally pioneered the influx of West Australian athletes to the Bay Sheffield carnival. Before Matt came along, WA athletes rarely competed at the Bay Sheffield and hadn't won a race at the Bay before.

In his second trip to the Bay in 1990, Matt stamped his name in the record books, coaching three winners at Colley Reserve. Dean Capobianco won the Bay Sheffield off 1.50m to become the first athlete to

complete the Stawell Gift/Bay Sheffield double in the same calendar year; Peter O'Dwyer won the 70m and Iain Dennis took out the I20m Junior Boy's race.

Matt also coached three athletes to the Bay Sheffield final in 1990 – Capobianco (1st), O'Dwyer (4th) and Ben Collins (6th).

Matt Barber's squad competed at the Bay Sheffield carnival from 1988 to 2016. During that time Barber's athletes won 14 races including three men's Bay Sheffields and three women's Bay Sheffields. He, in fact holds the record for the most victories in the premier men's (3) & women's (3) 120m open events with six.

Matt has had 15 finalists in the Men's Bay Sheffield – a record for any interstate coach.

Hall of Fame Inductee - Alicia Wrench Doody

Alicia commenced competing with the SA Athletic League in the 2007/2008 season.

In her first season with the SAAL, Alicia ran 5th in the 2007 Bay Sheffield (14.34 off 8.25m) after her 3rd place in the Women's 70m (8.59s off 5.0m) on Day One.

The following year, Alicia returned to the Bay Sheffield as the hot favourite and emphatically won the Bay Sheffield by 4m. (13.73s off 7.25m). A week later Alicia became the first and only athlete to win the Women's Bay

In March 2009, Alicia ran 3rd in the Australian open national 100m title behind Sally Pearson and Melissa Breen and was 2nd in the 200m to Breen. This earned Alicia a trip to Osaka, Japan as part of the Women's 4x100m relay squad.

Alicia immediately became an event backmarker for future women's Bay Sheffield sprint events. She was the tightest handicapped SA athlete in the 70m and 120m for the next five years - 2009 to 2013. Only NSW based athletes Laura Whaler, Piranee Steinert and Christine Wearne were handicapped behind her in a couple of the years they attended the Bay Sheffield.

Her victory in the 2011 Women's 70m off 1.50m is the lowest handicap any South Australian (male or female) athlete has won a short sprint (70m) event at the Bay Sheffield.

Overall, Alicia made 5 finals, including 3 in the Women's Bay Sheffield. In three of them she was the backmarker and won 2 sashes.
